# Looking after a child with a HIGH TEMPERATURE

The normal temperature range of children is: Under 6 months 36.5 - 37.5 C Over 6 months 36 - 37 C

#### TAKING THE TEMPERATURE

Glass thermometers are not advised for use with children. Several alternatives are available from the chemist.

The temperature should be taken under your child's arm (in the armpit), on the forehead, or in the ear.

Read the manufacturer's instructions and follow closely.

Here are some points to help you care for your child during this time.

# IF THE TEMPERATURE IS ABOVE NORMAL BUT BELOW 37.8 C

Take off most of your child's clothes and dress in vest (and nappy).

Encourage your child to drink plenty of fluids.

Re-check the temperature after 30 minutes to ensure it is not continuing to rise.

#### IF THE TEMPERATURE IS 37.8 - 39 C

Take off your child's clothes (other than nappy).

Encourage your child to drink plenty of fluids.

Give Paracetamol (Calpol) according to the instructions on the bottle.

Try to avoid cuddling your child too closely as your body heat may further increase the temperature.

Re-check the temperature after 30 - 40 minutes to ensure it is not continuing to rise.

#### IF THE TEMPERATURE IS ABOVE 39 C

Give your child a wash in lukewarm water and allow the water to dry on the skin.

Leave your child without clothes (other than a nappy)

Socks should be placed on cold feet.

Give your child Paracetamol (Calpol) and / or Ibuprofen (Nurofen) according to the instructions on the bottle.

Encourage your child to drink plenty of fluids.

Re-check the temperature in 30 minutes.

Contact your G.P. if you are worried, if the temperature is persistently high, or your child refuses to drink.
