Immunisation	Evidence	Time scales for acquiring evidence in OHD if not provided by employee
Non-Exposure Prone Procedures (non EPP)		
Varicella (chicken pox)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> a signed self declaration on our Occupational Health form stating a strong history/brought up in the UK or a positive serology report if born/brought up outside of the UK 	Varicella x2 - 28 days from date of 1st vaccination. Blood test 5 -7 days. NB If the test is negative, Varicella x2 vaccinations will be required
Tuberculosis (TB)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> proof of your BCG scar being sighted by a GP or Occupational Health Professional on headed paper from their practice, signed & stamped stating their professional pin number or Proof of a positive skin test result either:heaf test or mantoux test within set parameters <p>Please note that this must indicate identity validated site</p>	Mantoux test and read 48 - 72hrs from date of test
Measles Mump Rubella	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> a serology report stating 2 x doses of MMR vaccinations or individual lab reports stating a positive antibody can be accepted for measles, mumps and rubella 	MMR x2 - 28 days from date of 1st vaccination. Blood test 5 -7 days. NB If any tests are negative, MMR x2 vaccinations will be required
Exposure Prone Procedures (EPP)- Additional Immunisations Required		
Hep B Surface Antigen	1. Evidence of a negative surface antigen test	Blood test 5 -7 days.
Hep C	1. A serology report stating a negative result. Positive results can be submitted for our occupational health departments review	Blood test 5 -7 days.
HIV	1. Candidates must supply a serology report stating they test negatives for the HIV antibody before they can work in an EPP role.	Blood test 5 -7 days.

EPP Bloods must be identity validated samples and be printed in English.

Please note: if the practicing doctor performs EPP's overseas, then we will need evidence of EPP bloods being updated on return to the UK.
