Staff praised at annual awards night

STAFF were praised at the Trust's Annual Members and Public meeting on Monday.

The event culminated in an awards ceremony covering several categories, including the announcement of the 2014 Cardiac Nurse of the Year.

Joanne Collins scooped the award making her the first Healthcare Assistant to take the title. She was presented with flowers and a cheque for £200 by Mr Ramesh Gandhi, Wyre Public Governor and retired Consultant Cardiothoracic Surgeon, who founded the award five years ago.

Her nomination said: "You can physically see patients' faces "light up" when she enters a room. She is the kind of person other nurses aspire to be like when dealing with patients."

Joanne, who works on ward 37 of the Lancashire Cardiac Centre, said: "This is a real honour for me. I can't believe that I have won when so many other fantastic colleagues were nominated. I try really hard to make every patient feel welcome and at ease. I believe it's the little things that make the difference and a smiling face and friendly ear can really help a patient get through their stay in hospital."

Also presented on the night was the annual Dottie Hall Memorial Award which goes to a member of staff within the surgical unit who consistently goes that extra mile for colleagues and patients. It commemorates Dottie Hall a much loved nurse at the hospital before she retired and who sadly passed away in 2011.

Caroline Howson was thrilled at winning the award and being presented with a gift from Dottie Hall's son Stephen. Caroline was nominated for being an excellent advocate for patients.

She said: "I've heard a lot about Dottie Hall and what an inspiration she was. To win this award for being like her in any way is a real honour for me. I can't take full credit for this though. I work in a fantastic team who are so supportive, this is really for all of us."

Stephen Hall said: "I was really impressed with the nominations and really very touched that so many of my mother's traits are being seen in other nurses and staff around the hospital. Any one of the nominees deserved to win that award but I think Caroline deserves it.

The evening also recognised staff who had served more than 20 years in the NHS and those who had

Marie Thompson (Director of Nursing) explained how the Formulary will be used to ensure continuity of care for patients, promotion of best practice in the management of acute and chronic wounds and the most cost effective means of delivering quality and efficiency to all care settings. It is expected that compliance with the Formulary is at 80%, the team are confident that this will be achieved based on the collaboration of professionals at the events.


Get set for this year's Staff flu campaign

completed their annual training and are in the process of allocating clinics within their divisions and flu clinic dates will be accessible on the intranet. For all staff that are obtaining their flu vaccines at their GPs can they also inform Occupational Health the date that they have had it. Last year was our most successful campaign ever as we achieved the national target for 75% of frontline staff needing to be vaccinated. We also vaccinated 74.5% of our whole workforce which was our highest uptake ever and among the best in the NHS. This year we are aiming to maintain and improve this standard and ensure as many of our staff as possible are vaccinated across acute and community settings. A flu rota will be available on the oneHR portal and the Trust intranet site to inform staff when Occupational Health will be running their clinics.
