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A promising start for our Flu campaign


THE TRUST'S annual staff flu vaccination campaign has got off to a good start with 43% of staff so far vaccinated.

Last year was our most successful campaign ever in that we achieved the national target for 75% of frontline staff needing to be vaccinated. We also vaccinated 74.5% of our whole workforce which was our highest uptake ever and among the best in the NHS.

If you work in the community, unscheduled care, scheduled care, or clinical support divisions (where there is a vaccinator) you will be vaccinated by a trained member of staff in the area.

Directorates will advise colleagues on where and when the flu vaccine will be available and up to date rotas will also be available on the flu vaccination intranet site, which can be accessed via the [home page](#) of the Trust intranet.

The Occupational Health department has the responsibility



for vaccinating the following areas: Corporate staff, Clinical Support and Facilities Management staff, Student groups, Volunteers and the National Artificial Eye Service.

Staff survey reminder

STAFF who have not yet completed this year's national NHS Staff Survey will shortly be receiving a reminder letter.



A total of 850 staff members received the survey this year across the Trust with our service providers, Picker, reporting that they have received 157 returns – a total of 18.5%. The full breakdown is published below.

Please can all staff who received the survey take the time to complete it as it does make a difference to the organisation with many of the positive changes made over the past few years in areas such as occupational health and wellbeing, training, appraisals, communication, safety, patient care and the environment, being introduced as a result of the staff survey findings.

We realise that many staff who receive reminders bring up the question of confidentiality.

We must stress that the survey is organised by our external partners Picker who fully organise the survey on our behalf.

All answers provided are fully confidential and The Trust does not have any access to any individual's answers.

Picker pride themselves on confidentiality and they prepare all aspects of the final report on the Trust's behalf. Last year's response rate was 47% so please help us improve that figure this year. The current response rate is 18.5%.



Abdominal pain pathway launched

THE Trust recently launched its newest pathway as part of the Better Care Now quality work scheme. The latest pathway focuses on Acute Abdominal Pain in Adults and was launched at a recent Grand Round. Around 90,000 patients in England annually are admitted with non-specific abdominal pain. The new pathway will help improve the quality and timeliness of care we provide for these patients by ensuring that the patient is referred to the appropriate specialty without delay. The pathway can be found on the front page of the Trust intranet along with all the other pathways launched as part of the Better Care Now project.



"Abdominal pain is one of the most common form of presentations and the care of these patients is crucial. "It is one of those areas that if we get wrong, can lead to serious consequences. There is no doubt this standard pathway will help us in our decision making process. "Timely action saves lives and this pathway will help us in that aspect."

Information for emergency department staff

Has the patient returned from **Guinea, Liberia** or **Sierra Leone** or cared for an individual with Ebola in the past **21 days**?

YES



Is the patient complaining of **fever** or **feeling unwell**?

YES



Without making physical contact, direct the patient to an empty side room **IMMEDIATELY** and **alert triage**

The facts:

- the risk of encountering patients with Ebola in the UK is very low
- people with early signs of disease present a very low risk to staff
- however, patients with Ebola can be infectious if they are suffering from diarrhoea, vomiting or bleeding

4D SCANNING SERVICE

Blackpool Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust is now offering a unique 3D/4D Scanning service at the weekends. This service will commence from the end of September 2014.

With state of the art equipment we can now scan in 4D. 4D is a moving 3D image. The images we print are static, so they become 3D. The clarity of your scan and pictures depend on the position of your baby and placenta, the amount of fluid around your baby and maternal size. The best time to have your scan is between 26 and 30 weeks. You must have had your 20 week anomaly scan at Blackpool Teaching Hospitals before attending for a 4D scan.

The cost of this scan is £80 and will last around 20 minutes and you will be given 4 pictures. The cost of a scan for twins is £100 and will last around 30 minutes. Please note we only take card payments.

Please ring **01253 957815** and leave a message with your details, we will contact you to arrange an appointment. This service currently only operates on a Saturday.

If, during this scan, we suspect there might be a problem, this will be explained to you in as much detail as possible. With your consent, we will contact your Consultant team or midwife responsible for your care and a full complete report will be sent to your health professionals.

This scan is in addition to your routine NHS Scan.
