

## Transition Pathway for Occupational Therapy Services at Fylde and Wyre

Age 11  
to 12

- Occupational Therapy to attend Annual Review of EHCP or contribute with written report when invited to do so by the school.
- Dependent on needs identified school visit to new Secondary school is completed to review environment and potential equipment needs.
- School visit in Autumn term to hand over any equipment provision or therapy programmes to be completed within school.

Age 15  
to 16

- OT to attend Annual Review of EHCP or contribute with written report when invited to do so by the school.
- Establish ongoing education placement. If a young person is moving to stand alone college (within Blackpool, Wyre or Fylde) transition visit may be required dependent on need and current provision/unput to review environment and potential equipment needs.

Age 17

- Children's OT to attend meeting with Adult OT to discuss upcoming transitions to adult services.
- Children's OT service will continue to support the young person at both home and school for equipment needs.

Age 18

- For those YP attending special school, referral to be completed to Blackpool Adult LD Team. A joint visit may be completed after this, dependent on the YP needs. The YP would remain open to Children's OT service for EDUCATION NEEDS ONLY.
- For YP within mainstream education settings and additional needs identified or ongoing OT needs, a referral to the local OT neighborhood team should be completed. Transition checklist should be completed with the YP and parent/family. They will then be discharged from the Children's OT service.
- For YP within mainstream education setting with no additional or ongoing OT needs the transition checklist should be completed with the YP and parent/carer. The YP will then be discharged from the OT service with a summary report and appropriate contact information.

Adult

- Once the YP reaches the age of 19 and leaves special school, the YP will be discharged from the Children's OT service fully. Home needs (for those YP identified) will have been transition onto adult service at 18 years.
