Thank you for your recent request for information.

- (a) Does your trust have a bereavement suite available for use by parents in the event of limited life expectancy of an anticipated birth of a child? We have a Bereavement suite on Delivery suite
- (b) If the answer to (a) is no, what alternative arrangements are available?
- (c) If the answer to (a) is yes, would parents of a baby who turn up at hospital with a sudden infant death be allowed to use the bereavement suite? Over 28days old with permission from the coroner our families will have choice of where the baby would be cared for, Butterfly Suite in Hospice, home, with the A funeral home or hospital mortuary.

Under 28days old would have above choices and also have the choice of care on Delivery suite Bereavement suite, dependant on the Coroner.

(d) If the answer is yes to (a) where in relation to the Labour ward is the suite located?

Within Delivery suite, but with Sound proofed walls and separate access door to promote privacy

(e) Do you have bereavement trained midwives? If yes, how many? We have 2 Bereavement nurse Specialists: One in maternity caring for early pregnancy loss – 28 days

The 2nd is in child health caring for from 28 days – 16yrs

- (f) Do you have a trained bereavement councillor at the hospital? If yes, what is the average waiting time to be able access support from that councillor? As above no waiting time
- (g) Do you provide any written information to parents following the loss of a baby? If yes, please name the third sector organisation information is provided

Information on Bereavement Nurse Specialist, information by SANDS, information on funeral services, information on registration and post mortem.

(h) Can you list the guidelines around infant death which are implemented by the hospital?

Bereavement Support Nurse Specialist Referral Criteria Funeral Options For Pregnancy Loss Under 24 Weeks

Funeral Options For Stillbirths And Neonatal Deaths
Stillbirth and Integrated Care Pathway – Management
Support for Parents following Suspected or Actual Poor Outcome for the Newborn
Missed Miscarriage
Management of Recurrent Miscarriage
Termination of Pregnancy (TOP)
Death of a Baby/Child/Young Person
Bereavement Support for families following the death of a Child

(i) Does the hospital provide support around funeral arrangements for infants or babies who have died at the hospital?

Supported throughout the choices by Bereavement Specialist, and by Hospital bereavement office. With written information from councils.

(j) Does the hospital advise parents on the advantages of having a post mortem conducted where this is not compulsory?

Given written and verbal information can be found on both SANDS and Child Bereavement Charity.
